I want to make everyone aware of something I recently discovered that I think is Fun, Cool, Interesting and FREE concerning genealogy. I recently discovered I am related to George Washington. Yes, that George—the guy on the ONE DOLLAR BILL.

While it is known in genealogy that going back far enough, many of us are likely related to one another; but documenting that tree of relations to see who the common ancestor is can be overwhelming. Fortunately, FamilySearch has done the heavy lifting and I only had to do a small part.

FamilySearch (<u>www.familysearch.org</u>) has an annual genealogical conference with top presenters around the world discussing topics that range from DNA to Irish church records. With Covid, the conference went virtual in 2021 and 2022. Coming March 2-March 4, 2023, will be RootsTech 2023. You can attend in person in Salt Lake City at a cost of \$98 or virtually for FREE. For the last two years, if you attended RootsTech, you would be asked if you would like your tree to be submitted to the big tree that results when all attendee's trees are combined. Last year I was told that I had over 2,000 relatives attending. I could click on any of those names and a tree would appear showing our relatives back to the common relative. Of course, you may attend RootsTech and keep your information private if you choose.

FamilySearch has added a discover genealogy page (<u>https://www.familysearch.org/discovery/</u>) to their website such that after you create a login and password and input a basic tree - you can see your famous ancestors and how you are related to them. George Washington is my 5th Cousin Eight Times Removed. Our common ancestor is John Halstead II (1535-1632) – gosh that man lived a long time for those days. I hope I got a lot of his DNA (mathematically not possible). John was born in Westbury, Gloucestershire, England.

This is not the same as being a direct descendant of George Washington, but it is close. We still share DNA, just not as much as if I was a direct relative. Still very FUN, COOL, INTERESTING, and FREE

I encourage everyone to sign up for RootsTech and see the thousands of new connections that await you without any trips to the library on your part.


